The weather was suitably kind as our youngest children went off on their annual school trip on Wednesday. There was a great feeling of excitement and anticipation of what the day would bring.



Whilst at the wildlife park the children had a hands-on workshop and were able to handle lots of different creatures including a bearded dragon, snakes, a treefrog, an armadillo, stick insects and even high-fived a tarantula.



We learned all about Australian animals as well as exploring the other animals at the park. The children behaved superbly with everyone getting involved and showing interest and respect to the creatures who were so kindly letting us handle them!







#### Play at Killerton

Our Year 4 and Year 5 children were very lucky to be able to watch a play performed by the Year 5 children from Broadclyst Primary School. The play was called 'Gertrude's Garden Party'. It was performed in short scenes around the gardens of Killerton House. Each scene told a little story from the prospective of different groups of people working at Killerton at the time, gardeners, housemaids and their family.

With Gertrude Acland being an anti-suffragist and campaigning against women obtaining the vote and her daughter Eleanor being a suffragette who believed women should have the vote, I am sure there were many heated conversations around the dinner table.

The final scenes involved the arrival of special guests in an old Austin car up the drive and then a number of speeches by Gertrude and other dignitaries of the time, who were then interrupted by many suffragettes and their placards. (A herd of cows also came to listen to the speeches from the other side of the ha-ha much to the amusement of the audience).

There are several displays on the suffragettes at Killerton throughout the summer.

#### Writing Competition

Every year we send off some entries to Radio 2s '500 words' competition. This year there were 135,000 entries. So far, we have been unsuccessful, however, this year, one of our children got selected via a draw to attend the final at Hampton Court Palace.

#### Topic: The link between Anxiety and Executive Function

#### Date: Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June

Anxiety can be caused by a lack of any of the following: Impulse control, Emotional control, Planning/ Prioritising, Flexibility, Working memory, Self-monitoring, Task initiation, Organisation. Also looking at Thinking Errors.

## Topic: Why does my child misbehave? Is it due to ADHD or poor understanding/language? Date: Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June

Is your child inattentive? Impulsive? Hyperactive? We will look at managing/changing home and classroom behaviours.

Both ADHD and undiagnosed language issues can cause chaos in the classroom and at home.

#### Topic: The Out of Synch Child - Sensory issues and dyspraxia

#### Date: Friday 29<sup>th</sup> June

Dyspraxia can affect language, speech, maths, PE, reading, social skills and handwriting. Find how to support those with what is now called developmental co-ordination disorder.

#### Topic: Handwriting and Fine Motor Skills

#### Date: Friday 6<sup>th</sup> July

Looking at basics with resources to take away. Ideas for left-handers, printing, joins, cursive, strengthening muscles for improving fine motor skills.

#### Topic: How to talk so kids will listen and learn

#### Date: Friday 13<sup>th</sup> July

How to listen so kids will talk "Will bring about more co-operation than all the yelling and pleading in the world." How to have co-operation without nagging. Specific solutions to difficult situations and challenging behaviour.
