#### Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

Part of my strategic role is to attend Devon School Leaders' briefings, which take place once a term. The most recent briefing took place on Thursday this week and included updates from the Regional Director of Ofsted and the DfE Regional Director for the south west, Hannah Woodhouse. For some time, Devon has had significant difficulties with providing good social care and support for children and young people with SEND. The situation within social care remains very fragile and a lot of agency staff are still being used to support families. The new Head of Children's Social Care spoke about the importance of providing better out of hours support, and improving Early Help so that families can access support quickly when they need it. Devon also has a very high level of SEND support plans for children, particularly those facing communication and social and emotional challenges. The local authority is working with Essex County Council to share good practice and the speakers from Essex shared their improvement journey with school leaders from across Devon. Although there are clearly many challenges ahead for Devon schools, there are also some really positive signs about action being taken to tackle some of these challenges.

#### Reception Children's Attendance

EVF Heads meet monthly for an 'attendance clinic', led by Mr Jolliffe. At the November meeting, Heads discussed the number of children in Reception who are taking holidays in term time. Although many Reception children are under statutory school age, every day really does count in school. Our phonics programme relies on children building their reading skills incrementally and missing a week of teaching means that children have gaps in their learning. Alongside this, children's friendship groups often re-form if a child is away and it can be hard for returning children to re-integrate into their friendship groups after a period of absence. Whilst absence due to illness and hospital appointments cannot be avoided, holidays in term time do have an adverse effect on children's learning and well-being. Please do everything you can to avoid taking Reception children on holiday during term time.
