Illness

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell.

There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about <u>managing specific infectious</u> <u>diseases at GOV.UK</u>. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school or nursery on the first day. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.

Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

The federation's board of governors work incredibly hard to support and challenge senior leaders in their strategic role. All the governors are volunteers who spend several hours or more each week on their governance responsibilities. Our Chair, Mrs Enright



meets with me every Monday morning so that I can keep her informed about the developments in each of the federation schools and we are joined by Mrs Margesson and Mr Edlin-Benwell [vice chairs] regularly for a fuller briefing meeting. Each school has a 'home team' of two or three governors who work alongside the Head to get to know one particular school in more depth. The members of the school teams read the Head's report ahead of each governing board meeting and then spend part of the meeting talking about the school with the Head. We have recently welcomed some new board members; Digory Smith and Sarah Butler have joined the board from Whimple and Lisa Price, Liam O'Brien and Hannah Jones-McVey have joined as co-opted governors.
