School Improvement Plan.

Every year the school produces a school improvement plan in the autumn term based on their knowledge of the children and the curriculum it needs to provide. The plan involves all staff in the process and is monitored by school governors. Our actions for the year are detailed below.

Action 1: To increase the percentage of pupils in all year groups achieving greater depth standard in reading, especially those achieving exceeding in Early Years Foundation Stage.

Action 2: To increase the percentage of pupils in Year 6 achieving expected standard in maths.

Action 3: To re-evaluate and update the rolling programme for the wider curriculum to ensure it accommodates the needs of all our pupils regardless of class mix.

Action 4: To re-evaluate and update our curriculum provision for Personal, Social and Health Education (P.S.H.E.) taking into consideration the schools Early Help for Mental Health Plan (EH4MH) and the new requirements regarding Sex and Relationships Education (SRE).

Action 5: To ensure children make at least expected progress in reading, writing and maths throughout Key Stage 2.

In the next few issues of CONTACT we will unpick them in more detail for you.

Action 1: To increase the percentage of pupils in all year groups achieving greater depth standard in reading, especially those achieving exceeding in EYFS.

What does it mean?

We want to ensure that children that achieve higher than the expected in Reception (exceeding) in reading, maintain this throughout their time at primary school. (Greater depth means children are working beyond what is expected for their age. Key points of measure after Reception are Year 2, 4 and 6).

How we will support you and your children:

Bookmarks are being given to every child in year 2 and above with the types of questions to ask in order to support inference. Parent information sessions on reading, to include guided and reciprocal reading will be run in the new year. We will be opening the library after school to enable parents to select books with their child in 2018. Suggested reading lists for children will be produced in 2018 to help encourage children to broaden their reading choices. We are also going to hold a 'Book People' book fair at the end of January.



How can you help:



Continue to hear your child read regularly, whatever their age or ability. Together with parent support we produce great fluent readers but as books get more complicated we need to work on the meaning of the words/text. This is known as inference. Think about the classics you read yourself as a child—it is also important to read/share more complicated texts with children that they would not necessarily be able to access on their own.
