Timekeeping

New year, new resolutions. There are an increasing number of children arriving at school after 9am. Sometimes this may only be a minute or two, however, this still impacts on how they start their school day whilst also disrupting others.

Children can be dropped off in the top playground from 8.50 am. Children should ideally arrive at school by 8.55 am to be in good time for a prompt start at 9.00 am. There is a legal obligation for the school to record all instances of late arrival.

If children arrive after 9am this will be recorded as late in the register. If children are brought to school after the registers have closed, you will be asked to sign them in at the office and this will be recorded as an unauthorised attendance.

Queries

Over the past few days we have been talking to children about their anxieties around a range of things, including involvement in events coming up. We will continue to support children with this. Life is hard for everyone and there are many societal pressures on us all. Although we understand parents may also have their own anxieties, it is vital that we also try to manage them and prioritise things that are important. I do understand that sometimes it is challenging to know what is important (particularly when linked to school).

If a child has forgotten something and we believe it is essential to have we will contact you direct. For example, a swimming kit is essential for those going on Monday, whereas having wellies to go to the Orchard Wassail today was not, as the ground was firm and fairly dry.

The office is receiving an unprecedented number of parental emails asking about minor things and we want to ensure we do not miss anything critical.



School Dinners

There continue to be a few parents that are expecting dinners to be provided when they have not been ordered. This is no longer possible. Since the return from Christmas, office staff have been very accommodating, and because a number of children have been off due to illness, they have been able to do some rejiggling. However, this will not be possible from Monday 15th. Office staff will phone parents requesting a packed lunch is brought in.
