Year 1 Visit to Whimple Church

The children in Year 1 enjoyed a visit to the Church to learn about the bells. With the help of a TV screen, Mr Algate (the Captain of the Bellringers) and two ladies from the team, were able to demonstrate how the bells are rung, and how they are stopped using wooden wheels. The children were surprised at the height of the bell tower and the length of the bell ropes, reaching from one end of the Church to the other!







Some facts we learned:

- . There are 6 bells in Whimple Church.
- . The newest bells are about 130 years old.
- . The lighter the bell, the higher the pitch (sound).
- . Bell number 6 is the heaviest and weighs about the same as an old mini.
- . The bell ropes are tied up for safety the children learned how to tie them up themselves.
