We have had another great week and the majority of our children have settled in well and are getting used to new mixes of children and routines. The cooler weather has helped as well.

#### School Day

All children are expected to be in school between the hours of 9am and 3.30pm. We appreciate that sometimes appointments are unavoidable during school hours - just be clear in the reason for the appointment so we can record absence correctly. Registers close at 9.10am and after this time absence is recorded as unauthorised unless contact has been made with the office and we are aware of the situation. Please help us, to help you.

#### Sickness

Unfortunately, we have already had a few children go down with a sickness big. This often happens at the start of a term. Please remember that if a child has been sick they have to be off for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness. When you contact the office to report the absence please be clear about this and then we will not need to ring you on the second day. If reporting absence by email please put the name of child and absence in the header. This helps us to quickly go through the many emails received. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

We have attached a guide for when to keep your child off school, or when you can send them in in relation to common illnesses.

#### Packed Lunches and Snacks

We continue to have a few issues with staffing for school meal service, despite this children are being well fed and helping out where required. Hopefully, this will improve next week.

#### Attendance

Schools are required to send a letter about attendance from Devon County Council twice a year. This letter was attached with last week's newsletter, but unfortunately had one date error. Not all of our dates are aligned to the federation this year - we have Monday 3rd June instead of Friday 24th November as our non-pupil days (see last page).

#### **Federation News from Mr Jolliffe**

The leaders and governors of the Exe Valley Federation are committed to supporting other schools in their development and from time to time we are asked to help support school leaders in other parts of Devon. This is always a valuable experience and we learn a lot from working with colleagues in other schools, which benefits our teachers and children in turn. A few years ago, we did some work with Chulmleigh Academy Trust, which enabled us to work alongside primary leaders there and share our learning journey with them. Earlier in the year we were asked by Devon Education Services to support the three schools in the Moorsway Federation, which is located on Dartmoor, close to Ivybridge and this year we will be continuing this work under a Management Partnership. This means that colleagues from Moorsway will be joining us for training days and undertaking school visits alongside EVF staff. I will be working with the senior leaders for one day each week, which will usually be a Thursday. I am looking forward to sharing our development journey with the Moorsway team and gaining from sharing good practice with them.

#### **Co-opted Governor**

There is currently a vacancy for a Co-Opted Governor on the Exe Valley Federation (EVF) Governing Board.
