You may have heard in the news that the Department of Education is focusing on improving attendance in schools. This has been triggered by significant increase in absence levels since the pandemic and more children not attending school regularly. As a group of schools, we have already done a lot of work on ensuring every child is in school every day unless they are ill and are now fining families who choose to take holidays in term time. Governors also pay close attention to attendance levels and the Lead Governor for Attendance, Olivia Burrow and I meet to review what we are doing to maximise attendance. I am very pleased to say that attendance levels so far this year have been very good indeed at nearly all the federation schools and one school is currently running at 99% attendance! Of course, it is early in the year still but I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their contribution to getting children to school as much as possible and avoiding unnecessary absences. It really is important that children are in school every day that they can attend and I am very grateful for your support in keeping our attendance rates so high.
