#### Safeguarding Update

During a recent premises and site security inspection our perimeter gates came under scrutiny. You may have noticed some changes have already been made to them. This is to ensure the safety of all children in our care during the school day.

The lower metal gate (by the bridge), and the top wooden gate (leading from the steps to the Victory Hall car park), will be open for people to use at the start and the end of the day but will be secured between 9.05 am and 3.20 pm. Please leave the gates ajar so other parents can enter the school before and after school.

Access into school during school hours will only be in through the left-hand blue main gate.

#### Changes in collection of children at the end of the day from Monday

All children in Ash and Elm class need to be collected from the lower Key Stage 1 playground area. Children from Elm will come down the ramp as they do now, whilst the children of Ash will continue to come out from the side door and walk around to the front of their classroom.

It would be extremely helpful if parents could stand along the playground against the main building opposite the class from which their child is leaving. If people can refrain from waiting on the grass area and keep this clear, it will help with visibility and safe handing over of all children whilst enabling others to leave.

Children with younger siblings have been asked to come and wait with the younger child in the lower playground. The children in Oak will be taken around to the top playground rather than walking across the Key Stage 1 playground.



Also, could I take this opportunity to remind you that if you are unable to collect your child at the end of the day and have made alternative arrangements **you must inform the office**. We cannot hand your child over to other people (even if we know them) unless we have your prior consent.

Finally, if you have to bring something into school for your child during school hours you must call into the office and not walk around school bringing things in. Again, this is to ensure the safety of all children in our care and your co-operation in all these matters is greatly appreciated.

#### Fisherman visit

Beech Class had a visitor on the 9<sup>th</sup> May from Lyme Bay's Fisheries and Conservation Reserve. Their education outreach representative, Neville, brought lots of costal objects, videos and slides to show the pupils in order to help them to understand why everyone needs to put a stop to overfishing and has a duty to protect marine life.

Neville, introduced the class to some of the wonderful life that exists below the waves in Lyme Bay, including cuttlefish, crabs, scallops, lobsters, pink seafans, starfish and lobsters.





Then he talked about how people can fish sustainably, using single lines and nets with large holes rather than nets with small holes. This means that only some of the older fish are caught and allows other younger ones to go free. This results in the healthy numbers of mackerel, wrasse, sole and other species of fish in our seas.

Some of us acted as fishermen and some of us pretended to be different fish, which was great fun. Right at the end, we all met Larry (a live lobster) and learnt about his life cycle. Many of us were brave enough to touch him and to ask some questions about him as well.

We all really enjoyed joining in with all the activities and everyone learned such a lot.
