# Another Safeguarding Update

You may be aware of a case reported in the press in June 2017, where a 4 year-old boy starved to death in his home in London, following the death of his mother from a fit. Devon County Council have asked us to update our procedures in light of this. Consequently, if we have not heard why a child is absent by 9.30 a.m. we will call the first and then the second contact number, leaving messages if unanswered. If this is unsuccessful and a child is absent for a second day without any given reason, then we will ring all contact numbers to determine the child's whereabouts.

So please help us to help you by ringing in to the office to inform us if your child is not in school and the reason for it.
