The Children's Society have produced a slang dictionary to support parents, carers and professionals to better understand the language young people may be using and support them to safeguard young people.

They have also produced an Emoji dictionary. Emojis are becoming an increasingly common method of communication for everybody. Emojis are simple to understand, quick to type and can get the tone of the message across. Just as understanding the language that young people use can be important for safeguarding them, we think it is also useful to understand how emojis can be used. If we have a better understanding of their meaning, we can foster better connections with children and young people, and identify any potential risks.
