This time of year is always a challenging one - cold, inclement weather, and dark mornings don't always encourage us to get going first thing in the day. Children can be dropped off in the top playground from 8.50 am. Children should ideally arrive at school by 8.55 am to be in good time for a prompt start at 9.00 am. There is a legal obligation for the school to record all instances of late arrival.

If children arrive after 9am this will be recorded as late in the register. If children are brought to school after the registers have closed, you will be

asked to sign them in at the office and this will be recorded as an unauthorised attendance.

Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

#### FROM MR JOLLIFFE

Residential visits are an important part of the personal development programme for children in the Exe Valley Federation schools as they give children the opportunity to gain independence and resilience by being away from home and trying out new activities for the first time. Last week's newsletter contained information about the two visits for this year, for Year 3 and 4 in late April and then Year 5 and 6 in June and I am in the process of making a presentation for parents for both visits with more information about what is going to be happening whilst the children are away. I do want to emphasise though that we appreciate that the cost of these visits can be significant for some families and that there is financial support available if you need this. Some villages have charitable trusts [such as the Richards Trust in Silverton or the Leonard Trust in Thorverton] who will consider requests from individuals for help with residential visits but there is also some funding that I can access as well. Please do talk to your child's Head of School or contact me via Silverton school office if you would like to explore this further; all discussions will be held in confidence. We really want every child to take part in the visits and I don't want cost to be a barrier to participation, so please do let one of the senior leaders know if we can help.

#### YEAR 3 and 4 RESIDENTIAL VISIT

The Year 3 and 4 residential visit to Okehampton YHA will be taking place at the start of the summer term. Children in Year 3 and 4 at Silverton, Whimple and Thorverton will be leaving on Wednesday, 30<sup>th</sup> April and arriving back the following afternoon [Thursday, 1<sup>st</sup> May]. The cost of the visit will be £95, which includes travel, accommodation, meals and activities for the two days. A payment plan has been set up for parents on School Gateway to enable you to pay over four months.

#### YEAR 5 AND 6 RESIDENTIAL VISIT

Year 5 and 6's residential visit this year will be taking place from Wednesday, 18<sup>th</sup> to Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> June. Again, a payment plan has been set up for parents on School Gateway to enable you to pay over four months.
