Attendance and Holidays

All school aged children are expected to be in school unless they are legitimately ill.

The government and Ofsted have high expectations of school attendance and expect children to be in school a minimum of 95%. All schools are reported and judged on this.

You will be surprised to realise that it only takes 10 days to take a pupil's attendance below 95%. 20 days absence and attendance is below 90%. If this happens regularly throughout the seven years of primary education, over 140 days are lost and this is equivalent to more than two terms of schooling. This has a huge impact on their educational success and fulfilment.

At Whimple, we are noticing an increase in the number of children with lower attendance along with many families requesting holidays in term time. Whilst I appreciate everyone's personal circumstances are different, we are having to be more strict when authorising or not authorising, and informing parents of the implications. If requesting a holiday absence, this has to be done three months before the dates and can only be authorised on each individual case. Also, previous school attendance has to also be considered as part of the process.

Honesty is the best policy - isn't that what we say to our children?

We do not want parents to feel like you can't ask and then just call saying the children are ill, as this will have the same impact and does not foster a relationship of shared honesty between the school and your family. This relationship between yourselves and the school is critical to the success of your time at Whimple Primary. We like to work with each other with respect, and not against each other.
