
KS2 Maths Information Evening for Parents

Attendance at after school clubs

Please can I remind you that if your child is in school and not attending a club they have booked into after school, that you ensure that the club leader is notified. As you can appreciate the playground is a busy place at the end of the day and it is becoming more difficult to ensure every child leaves with the correct adult.

Using parents' and volunteers' cars

Increased focus on keeping children safe means as a school we have to ensure the appropriate paperwork is completed to protect our children as well as our volunteers.



"Where parents and volunteers' cars are used on school activities the head should notify parents and volunteers of their responsibility for the safety of pupils, to maintain adequate insurance cover and to ensure their vehicle is roadworthy and has a current MOT certificate."

If you are willing to offer you services as a driver we need a form read and signed alongside a DBS check.

Please don't be put off by the paperwork; this only has to be completed once. We would like to compile a list of volunteers we can ask appreciating that we do not expect you to be available all the time. Collect forms from Mrs Smith in the office.
