
Welcome

Oak have been working hard to design and create their own Christmas cards. The children were given some ideas of what they could create, however they worked really hard to make their cards unique and special.










Glider Challenge

Beech Class having accepted the Royal Air Force museum glider challenge, have been busy making cardboard prototypes, then polystyrene final models. Each group then flew their glider three times from a launcher (a piece of guttering and strong elastic). Many designs were successful and the class learnt a lot about the design process and aerodynamics. Henry, Theo and Arlo were the winning team, with the longest flight of 5.3m and will now enter the regional rounds of this national competition.

One of the modifications made was adjusting the wing span so the air resistance would help the lift when it takes off.

A problem some had was that because it's Christmas the hall was decorated and their gliders crashed into one of the hanging decorations, which was not planned! One of the teams commented, "It was very funny when our plane crashed but it was also very annoying".



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
