We had a number of staff running around at the end of today as 6 children did not turn up to football. We were concerned about their safety as we didn't know where they were.

Road safety update from the governors.

One of our roles as governors is to ensure the safety of our children. You may have noticed a few of us standing outside the main gate at drop off and pick up times. Thank you for those that stopped to say what a good idea it is. The zig-zag lines are there to keep the children safe and must not be parked or stopped on (not even for a minute). These road markings help protect pupils by giving them clear sightlines when crossing roads outside the school. They also create clear sightlines for passing motorists





Unfortunately we can't be there every day so as Mrs Shilston said last week, if you see anyone stopping on the lines please ask them politely to move.

FOWS have bought a lovely new sign to go outside the gate and I have approached Devon County Council, who have agreed to repaint the lines. I have also requested for the zig-zag lines to be extended to the entrance of the village hall and for an official yellow sign to be put up, although this may take a bit longer.
