Can I remind you to not congregate in key areas, for example, around the village hall entrance and on pavements as this is making it tricky for some children and their families to get past.



Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (P.S.H.E) and Relationships, Sex and Health Education (R.S.E) Parent Consultation

As you may already be aware, the Department for Education has announced changes to relationships and sex education following nationwide consultation. These changes have come into effect from September 2020 but full implementation in schools has been delayed due to the current covid19 situation. All schools will be required to comply with the updated requirements by the summer term 2021.

The new guidance focuses on healthy relationships and keeping children safe in the modern world. It also covers a wide range of topics relating to physical and mental health, wellbeing, safeguarding and healthy relationships.

Main changes:

- The puberty lessons taught previously at Year 6 will now be taught at the end of Year 5 as children are developing earlier, (these lessons will be taught in single sex groups).
- The scientific names for body parts will be taught from Year 2, (see Changing Me document)
- We are going to teach the statutory elements of sex education as determined by the National Curriculum for science, (see attachment Curriculum coverage science, relationships education and health education)
