

#### PARENTKIND WINTER COAT CAMPAIGN

As winter is approaching, Parentkind has teamed up with FatFace to provide winter coats for children who would not otherwise have one. The girls' coats are a teal colour and are described as being perfect for chilly weather. With cuffed sleeves, deep pockets, a supersoft inner lining, and a stunning faux fur hood, she'll stay nice and toasty all day long. The boys' coats are navy blue and are softly padded for maximum comfort and lined with supersoft material, this padded jacket is everything they need to stay nice and toasty. After submitting a range of evidence, we found out that we have achieved the Gold Award. This is a significant achievement having only been involved with Skills Builder for three years. Staff have worked hard with the children to help embed the skills across the school.






#### Keep it Simple

Our reward system matches the 8 skills. Each child is in a team - Badgers, Hedgehogs, Rabbits or Squirrels. Tokens are labelled with each skill and any member of staff or pupil can give a token. All classrooms and communal areas have displays linking the skills

to our 6Rs.



Children in all classes from EYFS to Year 6 earn weekly certificates which make specific reference to the skills. These are shared on a community-wide notice board, and then with parents. Skills lessons are taught weekly with a half-termly focus. Team points (tokens) are collected and

counted weekly by our Year 5 and 6 children. Totals for the half-termly focus skill and overall points are announced in a Friday assembly. Each half-term the winning team 'win' a 'mufty' day.

#### Measure It

Skills Builder Passports have been made for school and home, for children to self-assess their own leaning against the skills.

#### Focus Tightly

Staff training throughout the year has reinforced the link between current learning behaviours and the skills. Each half term has a focus for teaching and learning and is shared across the whole school. Timetabled sessions each week are to teach and practice skills.





#### Keep Practising

Evidence of class teachers using the skills as part of everyday teaching and learning across the school. This has formed part of everyday school life in all key stages. The essential skills are embedded into our curriculum and teachers are raising awareness of these skills across many curricular areas.

#### Bring it To Life

All classes take part of a Skills Builder Challenge Days at least once a year. Children work in groups to learn about and implement the skills in a real life situation. Whole School career assemblies have included talks from occupational therapists and Royal Navy Submariners, and more are planned.

Next Steps: To develop working with parents further through a parent workshop.
