Federation News from Mr Jolliffe



As a Federation community, we all want our children to grow up with strong social skills, active imaginations, and the ability to concentrate, learn, and thrive, so they can transition into adulthood with the skills they need for life. Increasingly, research shows that delaying smartphones and social media use can support children's wellbeing, protect them from online pressures, and help them stay more engaged in real-world relationships.

Smartphone-Free Childhood, SFC, is a growing movement of parents and carers who are choosing to delay giving children smartphones until at least age 14, and social media until 16. When parents act as a group, children feel less pressure, and families feel more supported.

As a federation, we're lending our support to this movement – not because we believe there's one right way to do things, but because we think this is an important conversation for all of us. We know that every family's situation is different, and many of you may already have devices in your household – for your child or their siblings. It's never too late to reset boundaries, build healthier screen habits, or take small steps toward a more balanced digital life, so we encourage you all to be a part of the movement.

To help establish this initiative across our schools' communities, we're looking for one or two parent volunteers per school to act as school organisers. At Thorverton, Charlotte Giles is already in this role and is happy to support parents in other schools to help to keep momentum across the Federation. The role is straightforward: connect interested families, share occasional updates, and act as a point of contact for the initiative. Charlotte will also help coordinate school organisers and guide the next steps with the SFC movement. YEAR 5 and 6 RESIDENTIAL VISIT

The cost of the three day visit will be £275, which includes transport, accommodation and all entry fees, including tickets for 'Matilda' at the Bristol Hippodrome.
