Topic: Ourselves!

English

Phonics:

- Children will take part in daily phonics lessons. They will continue to develop their Phonic knowledge and revise and consolidate phonemes covered last year from phases 2, 3 and 5. This will be through the use of a new systematic phonics programme called 'Little Wandle'.
- Begin learning Phase 5 sounds in preparation for the year 1 Phonics Screening in the Summer Term. Reading:
 - We will continue to have a daily story time where children will be encouraged to listen to a story and join in with predictable phrases and to discuss the story, helping to build their understanding and comprehension of different types of texts.
 - The children will take part in group reading sessions in school using the Little Wandle scheme, where books are selected to match to each child's phonic knowledge. These books will be shared in group reading sessions on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and sent home with your child on Wednesday.
 - A library book (selected by your child and not matched to their phonic knowledge) will be sent home weekly on a Friday for you to share with your child.

Writing:

- This term we will be focusing on letter formation, writing simple sentences using spaces between words, capital letters and full stops. The children will be learning how to use the word 'and' to join clauses and how to punctuate a sentence with a question or exclamation mark.
- The children will continue to develop correct letter formation through the Letter Join programme and daily writing activities. They will focus on a different group of letters every few weeks.
- Year 1 will have weekly spellings to learn which all focus on a particular spelling pattern, e.g. 'nk' words. These will go home on a Friday and children will be tested the following Friday.

Maths

We will follow the Hamilton scheme for maths and this term we begin with Number and Place Value within 10 which will help to build strong foundations and a secure understanding of numbers. We will progress through to Addition and Subtraction within 10, followed by Geometry (2d and 3d shape) and then we will finish the term by looking at Number and Place Value again, but extend the children's knowledge by focusing on numbers to 20. Children will also take part in a daily mental maths programme called Number Sense. This programme develops fluency in number facts. It is a highly visual programme, teaching core facts and strategies to enable children to develop a deeper understanding of numbers.

Science – This term we will learn about Animals, including humans and Seasonal Change. We will look at change over time by comparing baby and adult photos of familiar people. We will use our senses to investigate fruits and vegetables and we will design a balanced lunch box. We will consider how to investigate what we hear in the playground. We will label parts of the body, measure and compare foot and hand sizes using non-standard units. We will look at weather forecasts and symbols, and measure and record the weather.

Art and Design

- Drawing and painting: As part of our' topic the children will complete a Self Portrait. They will explore a
 variety of sized brushes and tools and also begin to mix colour shades and tones. They will also
 experiment with a range of drawing media.
- Collage and printing: In the second half of the autumn term we are hoping to go on some welly walks around the village collecting, sorting, naming and matching autumn colours and objects.

Music

• We learn about Music through the Charanga English Model Music curriculum. The first half term will focus on 'How can we make friends when we sing?' The theme for this unit is looking closely at the beat. In the second half term we will look at 'How music tells stories from the past' where we will focus on adding rhythm and pitch.

Religious Education

- We will be asking 'What makes people special?' We will focus on Islam and will learn to retell a story from the Qur'an, recall a way in which Muslims pray and make connections with their own experiences.
- During the second part of the term the children will be exploring Christmas and the birth of Jesus.

Computing

- Children will learn about computer systems and networks, the technology around us and what it is for.
- Data and information Grouping Data: identity, label, count and sort objects and answer questions about them.

Geography and History

- Our geography learning this half term will focus on the local area and then extend this to other UK countries and capital cities. We will explore Google Earth and look at whereabouts in the UK we live.
- Our history learning is going to look at the history of where we live. We are hoping to visit the Heritage Centre and explore how the school has changed since it was built.

Languages - In the morning we will greet each other in a variety of languages. We will also practise simple vocabulary and phrases in French.

Physical Education - We will continue to use the 'Real PE' scheme, concentrating on personal and social skills. We will learn to work on simple tasks by ourselves, to follow instructions and to practise safely and also to work sensibly with others, to take turns and share. Children will learn a range of fundamental skills to include gymnastics and dance using the Get Set for PE Scheme.

PSHE – We follow a programme called 'Jigsaw' and use 'Jigsaw Jack' in our circle time and PSHE lessons. This term we are looking at 'Being in My World' and next term 'Celebrating Differences'.

Skillsbuilder - Teamwork (Respect) and Listening (1st half term), Leadership (Responsibility) and Speaking (2nd half term)

How to help:

- Read your child's reading book at home at least twice a week and discuss the text.
- Talk about healthy eating, use vocabulary for parts of the body, use the senses to discover the world around you.
- Enable children to help with everyday maths at home, such as measuring and weighing items, paying for things in the shop, looking at the time and discussing what happens at certain times of the day.
- Play board games as a family.
- Encourage your child to write names on birthday and Christmas cards using their phonics skills.
- Start supporting your child to access Google Classroom and Purple Mash on a computer at home, help them to learn their passwords to access the accounts. Help them to learn to type their name using a keyboard.

All the children have come back to school with a positive attitude and a readiness to learn. They have welcomed the new reception children and have been really good role models to them.
