From speaking/answering back to adults inappropriately, hurting others and making poor decisions about their behaviour in class and outside in the playground. I do not think the recent weather has helped, and we have talked to the children about what behaviours we expect to see in school.

Many of you may well be experiencing this at home too, so we all need to work together to support and encourage the children to make better decisions. If anything significant has happened with specific individuals you will have been notified; I am talking here about general behaviours that disrupt the learning of others.

### Few Reminders:

### Toys

Please can you help to remind children that they should not be bringing their own toys into school. The toys can bring all sorts of issues and complications. Thank you for supporting us with this.

### Swimming Stars on Monday

Swimming will start for the children in Beech, including Year 4 in Oak on Monday 16th January, children need to bring their swimming kits.

### School Day

School starts at 9am, so ideally we need children in class slightly before in order to be organised and ready. I know at this point of the year there are challenges, dark mornings being one of them, but some children are now arriving until well after 9am. Children not in school by 9.10am are marked as an unauthorised absence. I also appreciate there are a number of roadworks/accidents happening that also hopefully, as we all get back in routine this can be improved upon.

### Strep A infections
