### **FULL GOVERNING BOARD REPORT – DECEMBER 2024**

The Full Governing Board met at Newton St Cyres on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> December. It was a positive meeting which focused on the continuing work by the Exe Valley Federation school leaders to improve the quality of education for all children across the federation and to keep children safe in the federation schools. Reports were received and discussed on safeguarding, behaviour, attendance and SEND, which governors monitor and discuss at each governor meeting. Governors also looked at and discussed the federation budget.

Re-federation with Moorsway was also discussed by the governors. The Exe Valley Federation continues to expand and flourish and re-federation with Moorsway allows school leaders and teachers across the ten federation schools to share ideas and expertise which can be taken back to their own schools to improve the quality of education in their school. This will benefit children in all the federation schools. It was agreed that as a federation it is important to continue to be outward looking and to support other schools to improve the quality of education offered.

# Wednesday 11th - School Nativity, Whimple Church - 4pm start

The children in Ash and Elm will be changed and given a snack at school before being taken to the church. Parents will be allowed to come into the church once the children are settled—this will not be until at least 3.45pm. Parents DO NOT need to collect their child from school.

After the nativity, children can be collected but we ask that you tell the class teacher so we can ensure everyone is safe.

# Thursday 12th - School Carol Service, Whimple Church - 6pm start

Children need to be brought to Whimple Church at 5.45pm and should wear their school uniform along with something festive. Parents will be asked to wait outside initially whilst we settle the children into their class sections and check we have everybody.

# Christmas Fair - Friday 13th - afternoon, parents after 3.30pm

Each class will get the chance to visit the Christmas fair in the afternoon.

Children can bring in a maximum of £3 to spend.

Parents can bring their children along to the fair after they have been collected form class at 3.30pm.
