#### Federation News from Mr Jolliffe



Over the last four years we have made significant improvements to the quality of education provided by the federation schools through developing the way the curriculum is delivered and this has been verified by Ofsted inspections at all the Exe Valley schools. We are now moving on to think more about how we can develop how we can design learning tasks to encourage deeper thinking and the impact this has on children's learning. This will be the focus of our work on Friday's staff training day, which will be led by the School Improvement Team and members of the Task Design Focus Group. They will be sharing examples of how they have used deeper thinking tasks to encourage deeper thinking and then giving colleagues time to design their own tasks for next term.

#### THORVERTON PRE-SCHOOL
