Skills Builder

This half term our focus skills are Staying Positive (resilience) and Speaking.



Speaking

Think of a story where something exciting happens. Think about how you speak when you are talking about something exciting.

What happens to your voice?

Do you use your hands?

Does anything happen to your face or expression?

Tell this story to your family, try to make sure you emphasise the exciting parts.

Ask your family to give you feedback on how you spoke about the exciting parts of the story. Tell the story again and try a different way of expressing the exciting parts.

Reflection Questions

Getting Started: How do we know if we are speaking clearly?

Intermediate: As you speak how can you put your points into a logical order so you can be easily understood?

Advanced: How can you use tone, expression and gesture to make your speaking engaging?

Online Safety - OMEGLE

Launched in March 2009, Omegle has recently become popular again. Omegle is a free online chat website that allows users to socialise with others without the need to register. The service randomly pairs users in one-on-one chat sessions where they chat anonymously using the names "You" and "Stranger" or "Stranger 1" and "Stranger 2" in the case of Spy mode

Omegle is not online safe. It pairs strangers randomly to chat with each other. A lot of things can go wrong from that harmless act. The user gets exposed to explicit content, violence, hackers, and strangers with all forms of inappropriate characters.

Technically, **individuals younger than 13 years of age are not supposed to use Omegle.** However, the 18 and over section of Omegle is for people who want to discuss adult content which is often sexual. This part of the social platform allows people to share videos that are not appropriate for children.

Easy Fundraising

It's great to see that more people are starting to use Easy Fundraising - we now have 39 supporters who have raised an amazing £1,125 over the last two years. This amount has enabled the school to purchase a reading spine across all the year groups.

More supporters on Easy Fundraising means more ways to enhance the school experience for the children. £60 would cover the village hall hire for a school disco, £250 would help subsidise the cost of a school trip or an after school club, and £350 would cover the cost of the year 6 leavers' party.

Easy Fundraising costs nothing to use, and has partnered up with a over 7,400 brands so you're more than likely to find the brand you want to shop online with. The app is so simple to use and tracks your own donations so you can see how much you've raised for the school.
