## Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

As the autumn turns to winter, the season for viruses and other infections tends to get underway as well and often children are not well during this time. The Chief Medical Officer and leading health professionals have written to schools to ask us to provide a clinical



and public health perspective on mild illnesses and school attendance. They have shared useful information for schools to pass onto parents including when is it appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with a mild illness. This may be found on the federation website under 'key information' and 'attendance'. There is a very helpful list of childhood infections and guidance about what to do if your child is not well. Schools used to have a 'Spotty Book' with this information in, which I always thought was very aptly named, with all this information in it but the information on the website is much easier to access and I hope this is helpful to you when you are deciding whether to send your child to school or not.
