THORVERTON PRESCHOOL

Thorverton Preschool Committee has made the decision to dissolve the current management arrangement and consult stakeholders about asking the Exe Valley & Moorsway Federation (EVMF) to take over the running of the preschool. This has become necessary due to the increasing complexity of the early years educational landscape, with the committee strongly of the opinion that the staff group require a more dedicated and professionalised support structure that can manage these complexities.

Extension: Pick which of your solutions is better and explain why.


