Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

I hope you had a good half term break and a bit of time away from the normal school routines. The next half term is always an exciting one in primary schools as we look forward to Christmas and all the excitement that this brings. As you know, keeping children safe is a core part of the work of schools and all staff have updated training on a regular basis to ensure that they understand how to help children if they need to do this. Another side of our work, which is perhaps less obvious, is ensuring that our recruitment systems are robust and that the staff we appoint are suitable to work with children. This starts with the wording of advertisements, through the application process, shortlisting, interviewing and finally to pre-appointment checks. On Tuesday this week, senior leaders worked with Jon Galling, who leads safer recruitment training for Devon Education Services, to update our knowledge on this important area of keeping children safe. We were re-assured that all our processes are robust and that there are safeguards in place to prevent unsuitable adults from getting jobs in our schools. However, our ongoing training also requires us to be vigilant about every person in school and to never assume that 'it couldn't happen here.' Thankfully, it is very rare for this to be problem in schools but keeping up to date with the latest advice is still very important.

YEAR 3 and 4 RESIDENTIAL VISIT PAYMENTS

The Year 3 and 4 residential visit is planned for Wednesday, 30th April to Friday 2nd May 2025 and we will be going by train from Crediton to the YHA at Okehampton. Silverton, Thorverton and Whimple will be going away for Wednesday and Thursday including Wednesday night; Cheriton Fitzpaine, Sandford, Newton St Cyres and Brampford Speke will be going for Thursday and Friday including Thursday night. We are still finalising the activity plan for the two year groups who are going and are waiting for confirmation of the cost. The visit is likely to cost around £110 for the two days, including activities, travel and accommodation. We appreciate that this is a significant outlay for parents so there will be a phased payment system set up on School Gateway for parents to start making payments of £20 each month towards the cost. We will confirm the price for the visit as soon as we can and let parents know.
