Whilst education has not been high on the agenda this time, the new government has made it clear that lots of aspects of policy will change during the course of the next parliament. Education has always been subject to political policy and each new Secretary of State has brought their own ideas and viewpoints to the role. Sometimes, these policies have a significant impact on all schools, but at other times, only some sectors are affected and the impact on small schools such as ours can be very limited, although it can be difficult to work out what new policies will look like in practice in our context. After 14 years of the same party being in power, there are bound to be changes as Labour come to power but whatever happens, we will make sure that the well-being and learning of our children remain at the heart of what we do here.
