A Message From Our School Governors

'Governors were very concerned to learn of several recent occasions when staff have been subjected to intimidation and threatening behaviour by some parents and carers. Such behaviour is unacceptable both in terms of the impact upon the person being bullied and as a damaging example to our children of how others should be respected and treated. Governors fully support school staff in following up such incidents to ensure they are not repeated.'

Website and Learning Platform

Both our website and learning platform are hosted by ESchools. The school website is available to everyone whereas our Learning Platform is only accessible to defined users set up with a username and password.



The Learning Platform is where we plan to communicate things specifically for parents, including photographs, as this is a secure site. You will also be able to book parents consultations here to save time and paperwork.

What happens next?

In order to set things up ready for parent consultations in a few weeks time we need at least one parent (but ideally both) to login to the Learning Platform where you will then be asked to reset your password by Friday 5th October.

How do I know my username and current password?

A letter for each parent on the system was given out in an envelope to the oldest child on Monday.

Parents Evening

These are now to be booked online via our learning platform. Times are available from 1.25pm to 6.15pm are will be open for booking from 7pm tonight until the day before the consultations.

Look along the top tabs to find one called 'parents evening'. Choose the relevant class consultation and then look for your child's name to book a time.

Private Fostering.

Are you looking after someone else's child? Is your child living with another family?

If the answer to either question is yes, and the arrangement is for 28 days or more, this is known as Private Fostering. If a child or young person under 16 years old (or 18 if they have a disability) is looked after by someone who is not a close relative, then by law Devon County Council need to be informed. When notified, we will work with the child, parents and private foster carers to ensure the best possible arrangements are in place for the child.
