Federation News from Mr Jolliffe



The government has published its proposals for curriculum reform this week, following the first review of the content of the curriculum for some time. The review was conducted by Prof.

Becky Francis and makes recommendations for changes to the curriculum that will come into effect fully in September 2028.

Each curriculum subject has been examined by the review group and minor recommendations have been made and accepted by the DfE. The review group has proposed that Religious Education, which currently sits outside the National Curriculum but is still statutory, will become a National Curriculum subject alongside all the others, which will bring it into line with the way the other subjects are delivered.

Citizenship will also become statutory so that all primary children are taught elements of financial and media literacy, climate change and sustainability. We already do a lot of this through our PSHE curriculum and through using published schemes such as One Decision or Jigsaw, but this change will mean that this important area is given a higher priority. Finally, the DfE has recognised that enrichment activities such as music, art, sport and drama are essential to a well-rounded school experience that supports academic achievement. All the federation schools already offer a lot of these enrichment activities covering civic engagement, arts and culture, nature and outdoor adventure, sport and physical activities so it will be interesting to see how this is supported by the DfE in the future. Our School Improvement Team and senior leadership team will keep up with the new curriculum as it evolves and make sure our schools are ready to embrace the changes that it will bring. The emphasis on citizenship and enrichment are very welcome and should enable us to further develop these areas in our schools from 2028 onwards.
