Compliance of GDPR and Safeguarding

There will a lot of very important paperwork coming home with your child next week in a named brown envelope (one per family).

The documents inside will include the following:

- 1. Data Collection Sheet please carefully check the information, especially contact numbers (of which we require a minimum of two) and medical needs.
- 2. GDPR Privacy Notice along with a Consent to Take and Use Photographs form again read carefully, sign and tick the relevant boxes.
- 3. Parental Consent for Local Off-Site Activities an annual form so we can take children to the MUGA/Forest School and walks around the village. (Reception children have already had this one so will not receive another).
- 4. Pupils Acceptable Use Policy just for Year 3 pupils as they move into Key Stage 2 and their knowledge and access widens.

In order to manage this huge amount of paperwork, please check carefully (you will be amazed at the number of people who forget to sign or tick a box). This will save us having to get back to you. Return all papers in the envelope it was sent out in. This will help ensure we do not lose anything, as the above is multiplied by 144!

Just to clear up any confusion with school meals. The Government funded Universal Free School Meal scheme is for children in Key Stage 1 and Early Years. These are the children in classes Ash and Elm. Once children are in Key Stage 2, i.e. year 3, meals have to be paid for. Please can cheques be made payable to Devon County Council and paid to the office at the start of the week.

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
