#### Scomis Online Safety Newsletter for parents

Please find attached to this email the most recent newsletter about keeping children safe online which includes lots of information on how to manage settings on devices and where to find out more on particular sites and games.

Over the past week, we have overheard some conversations regarding YouTube and a few videos that have not sounded suitable for the age of child discussing them. Whilst we appreciate there is a lot of good content available, there is an awful lot more than is very unsuitable and not age appropriate for primary aged children. Please help keep your children safe by monitoring their viewing, particular if you have older siblings in the household. The advice is to have open conversations about their viewing rather than stating what can and can't be watched as children will often work out how to do so without your knowledge. Parents and educators are not expected to know everything about what is available, as let's be honest, that would be impossible, however open conversations and ensuring children know how to report content they are uncomfortable with is vital.
