# School Meals

The school dinners are now live on the School Gateway.

Please would you book your school lunches for the first week back after Easter. The deadline will be midnight on Wednesday 10th April.

Unfortunately the cost of our meals will be increasing after Easter, this means that where your child pays for a meal, it will cost  $\pounds 2.85$  from the start of next term. (This does not impact Children in Reception, Year 1 & 2, or children who qualify for Free School Meals)

# Craft Club

# Water Bottles

Following conversations in school over the past half term, we have decided that from the summer term onwards, we will not be providing school water bottles for children. We have found that they are very difficult to keep clean and are conscious of maintaining good hygiene standards. After the

Easter holidays, please send your child to school with a named bottle each day (it will not stay in school and will come home at the end of each day, much like a snack pot or lunch box). If you have any issues in sourcing a bottle, please let school staff know and we will support you in providing one for your child. Provision will be made for children to have a cup of water to drink during lesson time where necessary.

### GOVERNOR REPORT

Governors met at Sandford school on 26<sup>th</sup> March to review a full agenda of items. Following the usual declaration of interest and the approval of the minutes from the previous meeting, Governors met with the Head Teachers from their linked school. This is a valuable experience for all Governors who have previously been sent a report by the Heads of Service and now have the opportunity to raise questions with the Head and discuss any other items that may arise.

After this Governors discussed monitoring progress in small groups. Issues like safeguarding and attendance were reviewed. Deeper discussions explored how these were dealt with and how the involvement of senior teachers showed that their involvement was able to make a real difference in these areas.

There then followed a review of the future of the governance structure and an alternative model of delivery was explored. The Federation has expanded significantly in recent years and the current structure needs amending. Governors discussed budgets and how these have been impacted by inflationary pressures and recent pay increases.

The meeting ended with some individual Governor updates and future implementation of a new behaviour policy which is now published on the federation website. A long session was concluded by a summary of how the meeting had impacted our children, bringing the focus nicely back to the reasons why many Governors give up their spare time to carry out the role.

Finally, a special thank you must go out to all the teachers, support staff and administrators who work so hard across the Federation to ensure that the children get the very best education we can deliver.

## KS2 Drama Club


