We continued to be committed to ensuring the safety and welfare of all our pupils at school. If you have any safeguarding concerns or you are worried about a child, please speak to one of them.

Please help us, to help you and your children.

We have more pupils on roll at school than we have ever had. This means our space, both inside and outside, is precious and limited. We would be grateful if you could help by reading and following some simple routines at the start and end of the day as this should make the busy times of the day easier for everyone and more importantly less traumatic for all children.



In the morning:

All children from Year 2 upwards can wait in the top playground from 8.50 a.m. onwards, parents are welcome to stay until the bell if they wish to. The children may put their coats and lunch boxes in the cloakrooms. Children in Beech and Willow should line up to go into class when the bell goes.

Children in Year 1 can be left in the Key Stage 1 playground from 8.50 a.m. onwards, however if parents wish to stay with their child until the bell they must wait with them in the top playground. This is to reduce the number of parents in the bottom playground and enable the teacher on duty to be able to supervise the children whose parents don't stay until the bell. Parents of Year 1 children are asked to let children put their lunch boxes and coats away by themselves. They should go into class when the bell goes.

Children in Reception can wait with their parents in the Key Stage 1 playground or be left from 8.50. When the bell goes try and encourage them to go into the classroom on their own.

Wet Mornings

If it is raining in the morning the children will be asked to stay in their classrooms rather then come back out to the playground. Please can you say your goodbyes before they go in and then we encourage you to leave so our sheltered areas don't become congested. The shelter in the lower playground is part of the outside classroom for the reception children and will often be set up with activities for the day so please refrain from standing under it. Mrs Terrett spends a lot of time making it look lovely. Thank you.

Home time

Parents of children in Ash and Elm, classes, (Miss Norton and Mrs Terrett) should wait for their children outside of their classroom in the Key Stage 1 playground. If you could stand along the length of the main building rather than on the grass area it enables greater visibility and access for all. Older children have been told to find their parents in the Key Stage 1 playground. All other children should be collected from the top playground. If you bring younger siblings into school please keep an eye on them as the playground is a busy place.

Children that have not been collected by 3.40pm will be taken to the computer room to wait. Parents need to come to the office to collect them so we know when they have left.

No child can be collected by someone else unless the school is informed prior to collection, so please phone the office to let us know if any collection arrangements have altered that we are unaware of.

Safety

The lower metal gate (by the bridge), and the top wooden gate (leading from the steps to the Victory Hall car park), will be open for people to use at the start and the end of the day but will be secured between 9.10am and 3.20pm. Please leave the gates ajar so other parents can enter the school before and after school.

Access into school during school hours will only be in through the left-hand blue main gate.



Children should not climb on the equipment before school - please could you reinforce the message with them.

Parking around the school

Please can I remind parents who have to drive to school to drop off and collect their child to **park considerately** and respect the villagers who live in the surrounding area.

Whilst we appreciate it is difficult when nearly 100 families are trying to leave with their children at the same time, we do need to ensure the safety of all of them, including very young children.



We encourage those who have to drive, to park at the Thirsty Farmer, the station or in the village square, and walk to school. A short walk in the fresh air is a great way to invigorate both body and mind.

Please DO NOT park in the village hall car park or block household entrances.

We want to have a positive relationship with all those who live in our community.

We'd love to have more older children join as well ass younger ones. Rehearsals are Tuesdays after school in the Victory Hall, pick up is by the side door at 4.30pm. Children may bring a snack & drink. They are registered in the library before going up to the hall together.

Beginner Guitar Club - Year 3 and up, no experience necessary and we have guitars available to borrow, (£20 returnable deposit against loss or damage). Children will be given a songbook to work from and practice with at home. Tuesday lunchtime 12 to 12.30pm in the annex.

Advanced Guitar Club - the existing group Tuesday lunchtime. 12.30 to 1pm.

Guitar clubs - £2.00 per session - £20 per child

Recorder clubs - £2.50 per session - £25 per child
