English

- To continue to work on the structure of writing, including paragraphs.
- Non-fiction- To write an information text on three animals organised in a specific way.
- Topic based writing activities- Earth day- how to help our planet? A whole class read of 'The boy with the bronze axe' by Kathleen Fiddler to inspire some story writing.
- On-going spelling patterns and rules.
- To make sure to use full sentences when answering comprehension questions in reading.
- For all children to be reading everyday, even if it's only five minutes/ a couple of pages.

- Occasional topic homework- will be set in accordance to what we are learning about that term. Return dates will be on the homework.
- Reading- it is really important that a child is reading most afternoons/evenings after school, even if this is
 just for five-ten minutes. I have already issued all the children with a bookmark, which have questions for
 you to ask. It is also lovely for a child to hear a parent or another adult read an appropriate book to them;
 this is a great way to promote an interest in reading.

There will not be any homework directly set that the children need to bring in and is marked by myself. However, on the google classroom there will be activities such as: times table grids, ideas for practising times tables, inspiration for story writing, handwriting sheets and you will be able to find the spelling lists on the class page. I am more than happy for children to send me things on the google classroom or to bring it to school to show me.
