# Whimple Primary School - Curriculum Newsletter Class: Willow Year: 5/6 Term: Autumn 2025



Dear parents and pupils,

Welcome to the first term! I look forward to spending a positive and exciting learning journey with your child this year. Here is a flavour of our curriculum for the first term leading up to Christmas:

## **English**

- Revisiting sentences and developing our understanding of how to communicate meaning effectively.
- Handwriting and spelling practice to build confidence and fluency as writers.
- Writing for different purposes, using the books Varjak Paw and A Drove of Bullocks as model texts.
- Whole Class Reading sessions to develop our understanding of how different books work.
- Sharing class novels together, starting with the book Wonder.

## What's the one thing we can do at home to support?

• Read with your child every day for 10 minutes. There is extensive evidence to show that reading to, and listening to children read has significant impacts on their learning across the curriculum.

#### **Maths**

- Thinking deeply, explaining clearly, learning together.
- Learning how to communicate our thinking through written, oral and visual means.
- The place value of number what does each digit represent?
- Using effective strategies for calculation to solve problems efficiently.
- Developing fluency using a selection of questions each day to support retrieval of things we already know.

# What's the one thing we can do at home to support?

Use your child's login details to Doodle Maths and ask them to complete their 'x a day' at least 4 times per week.
 The app is free of charge and children can use their school subscription.

#### Science

#### What's the one thing we can do at home to support?

• Visit the local library (or come to the library at school!) and look for non-fiction books about these subjects. There are so many great authors who write in a factual way which will help your child engage in their learning.

- Thinking about thinking: what strategies help us to learn? Remember? Solve problems?

- Using the schools 6Rs to inform personal development.

- Autumn term 2: Leadership and Speaking

## What's the one thing we can do at home to support?

• Talk to your child about their responsibilities and how to be a positive member of the communities they live in. We will be thinking about volunteering later in the year, so talking about this now will certainly help.

While it is important to continue your child's learning journey at home, I would like all extra work to be enrichment of their learning in the classroom. So alongside daily reading and regular Doodle Maths, your child will be given:

- Spellings: children will be given a set of spellings every week. These will be set and tested on a Wednesday.
- Homework activities: the attached homework grid outlines some ideas that your child could attempt. Ideally, they will bring one piece of work in per week to be shared on display.

All homework will be set via Google Classroom, but provision can be made for anyone who is unable to access this at home. If you have any further questions regarding any of this information, or have any queries regarding your child's time in Willow Class in general, please do not hesitate to ask.
