A Welcome Return for All



Our Jigsaw theme for the term is 'Healthy Me'. This will be our overarching theme for March to ensure the mental and physical wellbeing of all of the children in our care. It is really important that we help everyone to settle back in and provide opportunities for the children to re-establish routines whilst discussing their thoughts and emotions.

Lifeline Services

Although our libraries are currently closed for browsing, we are offering a few lifeline services.

Digital Library

We have been increasing our catalogue of eBooks and eAudiobooks for children including our Beginner Reads collection. This means that families who do not currently have access to books from school can find new things to read via their laptops, tablets, eReaders or smartphones.

For the grownups in addition to eBooks we have free access to eMagazines and newspapers and other digital resources such as Ancestry Online.

You will need to be a library member to access these resources but joining online is free and easy via our website [Devon Libraries](#) or [Torbay Libraries](#)

Choose & Collect

If you are unable to access our online resources and need to borrow physical books, some of our libraries are open for Choose & Collect. This service is currently strictly by appointment to make sure everyone stays safe. Again, we have boosted our collections of children's Beginner Reads to support those children learning to read, and we have also increased our non-fiction collections in some libraries to support some popular topics from the school curriculum. Arts Award

Finally, in a couple of weeks we will be launching a webpage that will enable children aged 5-12 to achieve their Arts Award (Discover) from the comfort of their own homes. We have partnered with a variety of local artists to create some simple arts challenges that only use resources currently found in most homes already. These activities will be freely available for anyone to take part, but families wishing to receive an official Arts Award certificate will need to pay £6 to cover the costs (although in some cases we will be willing to waive this fee for families where this cost presents a barrier to taking part).
