Federation News from Mr Jolliffe



In last week's newsletter there was a reminder about attendance and the standard letter about holidays in term time was sent to all families alongside their school's news. The DfE published new regulations for schools on improving attendance in August this year and Devon County Council have now written an updated letter that we have to send to all parents twice a year, reminding you about the regulations around school attendance. The amount that the local authority fines parents for taking children on holiday in term time has increased to £80 for a first penalty notice if it is paid within 21 days, rising to £160 if paid between 21 and 28 days. All schools are required to follow the regulations for authorising holidays in term time and there are very few reasons for us to allow children to be out of school for this reason. Senior leaders meet monthly to review attendance and monitor both lateness, absences and holidays very carefully. We have to report attendance to governors each term and explain what we are doing to improve or maintain good levels of attendance in our schools.

Under the new regulations, it is extremely unlikely that Heads will authorise avoidable absences such as holidays taken in term time. The term dates, including the two Staff Development Days in November and June, are published on the federation website until July 2026 so that you can plan holidays well in advance. Please help us by not requesting holidays in term time as we cannot authorise them and are required to report these to the local authority who will issue fines.

Secondary school admission applications for September 2025 are now open!

If your child has just started Year 6 you can apply now for their place at secondary school for September 2025.

For most schools in Devon, there is an <u>admissions priority for children if they live in the school's</u> <u>designated area</u>. You can also <u>explore other schools</u> to find which is the best fit for your child's needs and interests. Don't forget to check with the schools you are interested in to see if they are holding open days/evenings/tours.

It's also important to be aware of the <u>school transport policy</u> so that you understand who will be responsible for getting your child to and from school before applying for or accepting a place. Once you've chosen a school(s), <u>use our online application form</u> to express your preference(s). You can name up to three different schools and these are equally ranked preferences, which means you can apply for the schools you most want without affecting your chances of a place at other schools. If you cannot apply online, please contact the Education helpline on <u>0345 155</u> <u>1019</u> and ask for a paper copy of the form to be sent to you.

Applications must be made before the national closing date of Thursday 31 October 2024. If you apply after this date, the application will be considered late and may be at a disadvantage. The date that all allocations of school places are announced in England is known as 'Offer Day'. For September 2025 secondary school starters this will be on Monday 3 March 2025. <u>Visit our website</u> for more information about applying for a secondary school place, including a <u>step-by-step guide</u>.
