The Exmoor Challenge is a great opportunity for Year 6 children to work together in teams to navigate around a course on Exmoor, starting at Dulverton School on Saturday morning. There are a series of check-points along the route and each leg has to be done in a pre-determined time; points are deducted if teams arrive too early or too late.
