#### Federation News from Mr Jolliffe



Over the last 12 months we have been working with senior leaders from the Moorsway Federation and supporting their school improvement journey. The federation comprises Cornwood C of E School, Shaugh



Prior and The Erme Schools, all in or close to Ivybridge. This has been a very positive collaborative partnership and we have benefitted from opportunities to share and refine our curriculum and leadership experiences with them. Governors from both EVF and Moorsway have agreed to move to consultation on re-federating in the autumn so that we are a bigger and stronger group of schools. This will mean that we can continue to work to improve outcomes for all our children across ten schools. The local authority and Diocese of Exeter are in favour of formalising our collaboration and enabling us to maintain our autonomy in this way. Alongside this, we will be starting to work alongside leaders from the South Hams Federation, which is a group of village schools that are very similar to ours. This will enable us to meet our shared vision to move forward together and go from strength to strength through sharing professional development opportunities. We shared some training with the South Hams leaders earlier in the year and felt that this went very well and that our vision and values are very similar.

There are still a number of aspects of this collaboration to consider before any decisions are made and there will be opportunities for parents and other stakeholders to find out more about how we will work going forward, in the autumn term. Governors from both boards will make a decision in the light of the responses to consultation at the beginning of December. This is an exciting time for us as the federation grows and becomes stronger and we are looking forward to the new opportunities collaboration that

will give us.
