#### Welcome back

We would like to give a warm welcome back to school to all our families. 'CONTACT' is the school's main newsletter and it is important that it is read thoroughly. It will be sent out by email regularly to keep you up to date with all that is happening at school but hard copies are available from the School Office on request.

We would like to start by welcoming Hannah Clarke to our teaching team. Miss Clarke will be teaching Beech class with Mrs Killen who is now working part time. The children have returned to school with positive attitudes and the new Reception children have made a great start and are enjoying their mornings with Mrs Shilston and her Early Years team.

We are at the start of another exciting term with new topics, visitors and visits. Keep an eye out for our curriculum newsletters which will have details of what your child will be learning. Our theme for learning this half term is 'What have you done today to make you feel proud' with a focus on books. Along with this we will be having our annual Anti-Bullying Week this term, our Harvest Apple Pick, class assemblies for parents, Bikability training for Year 6, a visit from Theatre Alibi and our Arts Week. Remember to check the calendar on the website this works as a phone app once you have entered the site. You can also login to the learning platform to check for class information.

#### **Fantastic Fridays!**

We will be starting our new Friday afternoon curriculum this half term. The children will be organised in their year groups and will cycle through the activities. The aim of our Friday curriculum is:

- To promote the school's 6Rs Responsibility, Resilience, Respect, Reasoning, Reflecting and Resourcefulness, in the outside environment.
- To enable children to learn to manage risk.
- To equip children with the skills to undertake problem solving activities.
- To enable children to work as part of a team, showing respect for everyone's ideas and challenging where ideas can be improved.
- To further broaden the school's curriculum.
- To show our commitment to the place of the creative arts in primary education.

- To promote mental health and wellbeing through 'mindful' activities.
- To promote respect for the environment.
- To equip children with practical skills

If you are free on Friday afternoon, can make a commitment of a half term and would be interested in helping with any of our activities please let us know via the Office. We are always happy to have extra help in school so whether it is hearing readers or helping with sports at the MUGA just let us know. Please note volunteers are subject to safeguarding checks.

#### Mornings

All childen from Year 2 upwards can wait in the top playground from 8.50 a.m. onwards, parents are welcome to stay until the bell if they wish to. The children may put their coats and lunch boxes in the cloakrooms but should not go in to the classrooms. Children should line up to go into class when the bell goes.

Children in Year 1 can be left in the Key Stage One playground from 8.50 a.m. onwards, however if parents wish to stay with their child until the bell they must wait with them in the top playground. This is to reduce the number of parents in the bottom playground and enable the teacher on duty to be able to supervise the children whose parents don't stay until the bell.

Parents of Year 1 children are asked to let children put their lunch boxes and coats away by themselves. They should go into class when the bell goes.

Children in Reception can wait with their parents in the Key Stage 1 playground or be left from 8.50. When the bell goes try and encourage them to go into the classroom on their own.

#### Safety

I will be reminding the children that they should not climb on the equipment before school – please could you reinforce the message with them. Can we also ask parents to make sure that the bolts are put across on the gates as they leave the playground.



#### Home time

Parents of children in Elm, Mrs Shilston's class, should wait for their children outside of their classroom in the Key Stage 1 playground. If you have older children they should be told to find you in the Key Stage 1 playground (we will remind them). All other children should be collected from the top playground.

#### Class teachers

If you need to speak with the class teacher we would ask you, where possible, to do so at the end of the day. The mornings are always very busy for the teaching staff who need to prepare for the school day. Children are welcome to take their parents into the classrooms at the end of the day to show them work, etc.

#### Clubs



Children attending after school clubs must go and wait quietly in the library until the person in charge of the club comes to collect them. Registers for clubs are always taken. If your child is in school but will not be attending an after school club for which they are registered you must let the person/organisation running the club know that they will not be attending. If your child has been absent from school we will inform the club that they will not be attending.

#### **Music clubs**

Choir is held on a Tuesday after school, 3.30-4.30 p.m. in the hall. Emma would welcome any offers from parents to stay and supervise (she will get you singing!) so please let her know if you can help out. For further information on music clubs please read on.



#### Sports clubs

Keep an eye out for flyers and emails about sports clubs and information on other clubs. If you would like to run an after school club then please let us know. The children would be particularly keen on an art and craft club and a chess club. These could be weekly or monthly.

#### **Additional Clubs**

Relax Kids has proved very popular and will continue to run on a Wednesday after school. Art and Craft club will run on Fridays after school. Both clubs will be run by Mrs Terrett. Keep an eye out for letters with start dates and information.

### If you have no option but to drive to school we would request that you park in the Thirsty Farmer's car park or in the Square and walk the last part of the journey.

This eases congestion around the school and makes it safer for the children. We will be leaving the top gate unlocked at the end of the school day but still politely request that you come down into the playground to collect your child/ren.

#### Music Clubs - Autumn 2016

Dear All,

As always, there are a variety of music clubs to give Whimple School's pupils lots of opportunity to take part & enjoy a wide variety of music. The clubs perform each term for the school, parents & community. The choir sometimes have other performances during the year.

The clubs available are:

**Beginner Recorder Club** - Yr 2 and up, they will learn to play & to read music. This will be during lunchtime, probably Mondays.

Advanced Recorder Club - the existing group, anyone who learned to play & read music at their previous school, + last year's beginners. After school on Mondays, till 4.30 in the library. Children may bring a small snack.

Whimple School Choir - Yr 2 and up. Rehearsals are Tuesdays in the Victory Hall, pick up is by the side door at 4.30pm. Children may bring a snack & drink. They are registered in the library before going up to the hall together.
