Safeguarding Support for Parents

NSPCC Helpline

We provide adults with advice, guidance and support, and can take action on their behalf if they have concerns about a child who is either being abused or is at risk of abuse.

The Helpline operates Monday to Friday 8am – 10pm and 9am – 6pm at the weekends.

The Helpline can be contacted by email or online reporting form 24/7. With advice and information that can be offered in English, Welsh and Asian languages, including Bengali, Gujarati, Hindi, Punjabi and Urdu. Our trained practitioners provide advice, guidance and support, and can take action on behalf of child being abused or at risk of abuse.



All calls made to and from the Helpline are recorded. When the Helpline receives information identifying a child at risk of abuse it will always liaise with the appropriate statutory agencies to ensure that action is taken to safeguard that child.
