After eating they will then go out to join their key stage in the playground; Ash and Elm in the lower playground, Oak, Beech and Willow in the top two playgrounds. 

Reading and Vocabulary

There has been a lot of recent press interest in the development of vocabulary in children and the impact on reading. We continue to encourage children to read as much as possible and time is set aside in school to do this. You can help too - reading with or to your child has been proven to develop the love of reading whilst developing their language and comprehension.

Please can you also ensure children bring in their book bags each day, especially in Ash and Elm Class. Reception children will have had two new reading books this week and these will be read again in school next week so it is really important to bring them. Research shows that children who read frequently and reread texts three times develop the best understanding. As books get longer this can be achieved by rereading chapters.



The first read is for enjoyment, the second read for comfort and stability and the third read for comprehension. Comprehension becomes more and more important as children get older - there is no point reading a text unless you understand it.

All children have also been able to borrow library books from their classroom stock but we are having many of these books unreturned. Please have a look this weekend and send them in.

National Share-A-Story Month (NSSM) is an annual celebration of the power of storytelling and story sharing, providing a fantastic opportunity to fulfil the core aim of the FCBG (Federation of Children's Book groups) of bringing children and stories together. Across the country Federation book groups and individuals run a whole host of events.
