We have been asked to make parents aware, (although many of you may already know), that cases of sickness are very high in Devon currently. It is essential that any child who has been ill must be kept off from school for at least 48 hours after diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms have stopped, and they are well enough to return. For some children with certain infections, this may need to be longer.

Unfortunately, community Covid cases are also significantly on the rise in Devon. Fortunately, this has not made it into school yet and ideally we would like to keep it that way. The guidance remains that anyone with symptoms of a respiratory

infection, such as covid-19 and has a high temperature or feeling unwell should try to stay at home and avoid contact with others. Testing is no longer expected.

We will continue to encourage children to sanitise and/or wash their hands regularly to help prevent transmission of Covid-19 and other infections in schools.
