Important Information for September

As you are aware Government guidance with regards Coronavirus is continually being updated. Schools have been given information to help support full reopening in September.

A new risk assessment linked to this has to be completed and submitted prior to September. This will also be available to parents.

The main points for your information are detailed below and these will hopefully help you plan appropriately for school in September.

- Parents will be able to drop children off between 8.45 and 9am. This will follow the current system where children will leave their parent in the upper playground and go straight into class.
- Collection time for children in Ash and Elm Classes (reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children) will be 3.20pm to 3.30pm.
- Collection time for children in Oak, Beech and Willow Classes (Year 3 to 6) will be 3.30pm.
- Where possible children in Year 5 and 6 will be encouraged to walk to and from home to reduce the number of adults needed for collection.

More detailed information will be sent out prior to children returning on September 7th.
