On the 7th July, Beech Class pupils went on their trip to the Bristol Zoo Project. They learned a lot about the bodies, lives and habitats of brown bears and giraffes when they attended two interesting animal talks.





They also saw a range of other animals: ostriches, wolverines, wolves, geladas, zebras, two kinds of lemur and meerkats. Many of these animals need help from humans at the moment so that numbers of their species increase in the future.

# **Smoothie Making for our Skills Builder Project**





# Our trip to Seaton Jurassic

We had a great day out at Seaton Jurassic learning about dinosaurs and fossils. We started the day by having dinosaur stories, going on a poo trail, learning about fossils in the fossil room and playing a game of guess who. After lunch, we then had fun in the soft play and went around the dinosaur exhibition. We finished off with making our own ammonites and fossil rubbings.













In our Art lessons, we have been learning the technique of 'weaving'. The children enjoyed exploring weaving first with different resources and then practised weaving with card first and then different animal shapes.







In DT, we have made our own fruit kebabs. First, we tried different fruits including flat peaches, kiwis, sharon fruit and melon, and then we planned what fruits we wanted to use for our kebabs.







In Literacy, we have been reading 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. The children enjoyed answering questions when pretending to be different characters from the story. The Reception children have designed and labelled a lunchbox for Mr. Grinling, and the Year 1 children have written more complex sentences, including the word 'so', based on the story.







In Science, we have been learning about habitats and food chains. We have looked more closely at habitats around us by exploring the school garden where we also looked for evidence of food chains. The children recorded their work by sketching and labelling what they found.

In DT this term, Oak Class have been exploring pneumatics! The children designed and built their own moving models using air pressure — from lifting arms to popping creatures. They learned how air can be used to create movement and worked brilliantly in teams to bring their ideas to life. A fun and handson way to explore forces and design!

After lunch and a play in the park, we walked to the RNLI Lifeboat station and took part in a tour and

In PE, the children in Year 1 and 2 have had a great time developing their speed, strength and agility with the Scrum Kids Coach through a mixture of teamwork and competitive games.









This term's Design and Technology project was to design and make a smoothie! We used a range of fruits and vegetables to make the smoothies with some being more successful than others in terms of taste! We learned a range of preparation techniques including peeling, slicing and chopping. Even if the final product was not to our liking, we still enjoyed the process!









In Art, we completed our printing project with these fantastic press prints. We drew a pattern onto a polystyrene tile, coloured in felt-tip and then painted water onto the paper. We had to lay the tile on top of the water to create the print.














Our most recent art work was all about textiles. We looked at the work of Rosie Lee Tompkins who was famous for her beautiful quilts. We created our own quilt style patch using cut out pieces of paper. We had to decide on the shapes and patterns and could be quite free with our choices. We then used applique to create a quilt patch with fabric. We chose a shape to attach to









In Music, we have been listening to a variety of different musical genre from classical to jazz. We have learned to sing lots of songs and have used the glockenspiels as well as untuned instruments to accompany them. This culminates in a whole class performance with singers, dancers and musicians all playing their part.







We took part in a lovely workshop run by Lou from Recycle Devon. She taught us all about what we should do with our rubbish and, in particular, how we should try to keep plastics out of our seas and oceans. With help from a very knowledgeable 'pirate' (Lou in role), we learned about the types of plastics that get into our seas and how this can be very harmful to both the environment and the creatures who live there.











The children were very excited to share all they had learnt about plastic pollution in our oceans by hosting an Eco Fair for members of their families. Over the previous half term, they have been working in groups to complete our Skills Builder project. This involved developing problem solving skills to design and make badges, working as a team to create eco superheroes, and practising their speaking and listening skills to share our eco message.
