- Real PE: cognitive and creative modules. Children will learn to recognise their developments over a period of time and be able to adapt in different tasks or activities

Personal Development

- Pupils will be following Jigsaw unit 5, Relationships, and thinking about relationships with and between other people as well as avoiding stereotyping. They will then study unit 6, Changing Me, that focuses on understanding the physical and emotional changes which are happening
