




Thank you for all your lovely messages, it's heart-warming and I look forward to the future, working with everyone and continuing to promote the best interests of the children in our care.



Children need to have their full P.E. kit in school everyday. Please include jogging bottoms to cater for cold weather conditions.




Waterproofs

School Dinners

Orders for children in Key Stage 2 (year 3 upwards) will be placed based on the completed meal forms handed in at the office. If your child is absent for the day, the lunch order will be removed. The school office must be informed of any other changes (before 9.15am) otherwise a school dinner will be ordered and you will be charged accordingly.
