Reminders

We are looking forward to welcoming back all of our pupils. It is great to know that all children are expected to be in school but it is vitally important that we remember that all other precautions and procedures continue to be in place. The Government have listened and reopened schools first as they value the importance of education, however, we need to be careful to ensure Covid rates continue to reduce - currently figures are where they were at the start of the November lockdown.

Schools have been asked to remind parents of the following:


- Face coverings must still be worn at morning drop off and collection at the end of the day.
- Social distancing continues with only ONE parent to collect.
- No social gathering is permitted.
- At present you are only able to meet one person from another household outside.

We continue to request that you:

- Park at the Thirsty Farmer DO NOT park on the road outside of school or in the village hall car park.
- Follow the one way system to drop off and collect children.
- To collect children from the playground and NOT wait outside the school gates. Please leave dogs at home.
- To leave toys, bikes and scooters at home only bring essential items into school.
- Do not arrive before 3.30pm for collecting children in KS2 as this prevents parents with younger children entering. Please wait on the coloured spots or wait distanced on the steps.
- Order school meals online.

Children are expected to wear their school uniform - if for any reason this is not possible, please let them wear something sensible. We appreciate that buying items like school shoes is particularly challenging at the moment. If you have any concerns, please contact me as there may be ways we can support you.

Breakfast Club and After School Club continue to be for parents of keyworkers only for wrap around care until Easter. After that, we may be able to offer some alternative after school provision.



World Book Day - Thursday 1st April


Hopefully, you have started to think about your costumes.

Reading Books and PE Kits

Please return all books including library books to school so we can change them for you. All books will be quarantined in the usual way.

Don't forget your PE kits—lots of exercise is planned. Key Stage 2 need to include jogging bottoms for going to the MUGA on colder days. If children in Key Stage 1 and reception could bring a pair of shorts and trainers to leave in school that would be great as they are going to be doing some different PE sessions as well.



Free school meals, holiday support and funding

All children automatically get free school meals if they're in reception class, year 1 and year 2. However if you get certain benefits, your child could also be entitled to additional support such as supermarket vouchers during the school holidays and other free activities such as holiday club as well as free school meals beyond year 2.

Don't miss out on this additional support. Make a quick application, where your eligibility can be assessed and an outcome given instantly, on our website. Alternatively, please call our education helpline on 0345 155 1019.

Any child that is found to be eligible for free school meals will also get additional funding for their school, this is known as pupil premium funding, which can be used to support your child in school or with the costs of uniforms or trips. Pupil premium funding can't be paid directly to parents or carers, but it makes a big difference to schools and eligible pupils.

Parents Protect

Parents Protect have produced two handy guides, helping you understand the sexual development of children under 5 years of age and those aged 5-11. They have used a traffic light framework to help you in identifying if a behaviour is GREEN, AMBER or RED. Available on the school website
