Children in Ash Class enjoyed a great day of outdoor learning yesterday, they all came back and were very enthusiastic about what they had been doing.

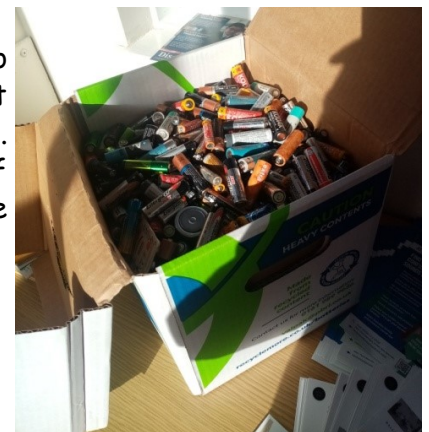
Park Run in June
